The yarn is Classic Elite Song, a DK blend of cotton and wool. The KAL was online and Amy coordinated it using our Guild's [Ravelry](#) forum. Well done, ladies!



Virginia Wilson carried a strand of Malabrigo Silkpaca and a strand of Crystal Palace Kid Merino together to knit the **Kiba Light Vest** from designer Marianne Isager.



Hanna Sudik found success with the **Sunwalker Shawl** pattern by designer Melanie Berg. Hanna used Madtosh Silk Merino yarn and modified the lace pattern for her take on the asymmetrical pattern.

Claudia Carlson used Universal Yarn Classic Shades Frenzy and US 10.5 needles to knit the **V-neck Cowl** from Hope Vickman. Claudia said the project was easy and took her only two nights to finish. It looks complicated but you are knitting only 11 sts at a time. More of Claudia's cowl can be found on [Ravelry](#).



Show & Share November



Karen Bochinski spun 20,000 yards of cotton yarn and then dyed it for her weaving projects. She added stash yarns and the end result was a coordinating set of large and small project bags.

Barbara Levin discovered the **Rikaart Cowl** on [Ravelry](#). The pattern uses 80 yards each of six colors of sock yarn. Because of its unique construction, the cowl is knit flat with and ends up in a circle, with no seaming! This would be a great knitalong project for a group of friends who split and share 6 skeins of sock yarn. It would be interesting to see how you plan your colors!



Sue Tavaglione knitted this lace top for her daughter using Dandoh Cotton Fine Yarn. The combination of many YO's and the paper-like laceweight yarn with no elasticity made the knitting challenging. Sue said the end result was worth all the work, and she finished it in time for her daughter's birthday.

❶ **Rippenschal - My Favourite Ribbed Scarf** is suitable for men, women and children. The needle size and gauge are unimportant and the stitch count can be adjusted to fit anyone.

❷ **DROPS Cardigan Pattern CL-002** is knit at a gauge of 5 sts/in. using US #7 needles. Perfect in cotton or wool blends, the sweater's sleeves are stockinette, and the back and fronts are garter stitch. Short row shaping forms the curved front hem, then the button band is picked up and knit using long circular needles.



❸ Set the places at your holiday table this year with a fun and unusual Christmas knitted cutlery holder. **Dinner at the Kringles** pattern uses US #4 needles and is a great way to try your hand at cables. This is knit flat and seamed.

❹ **New Growth** is a bottom-up, charted shawl pattern. It can be knit in two sizes, using one or two skeins of your favorite sock or DK weight yarn.

❺ Get the pattern for the **Feather Lace Boot Topper** PLUS a tutorial on How to Read a Lace Chart

❻ Super bulky yarn is all the rage. Indulge in a single skein and knit the Instant Love Hat with US #13 needles. Free pattern on Craftsy.com

✓ Master the **Russian Join** for joining two balls of yarn. Free video tutorial.
