# More Details for the Wednesday November 4<sup>th</sup> Needle Felting Workshop With Fayla Reiss...

<u>-Supplies & Materials</u>- At the workshop, you can give Fayla cash or a check for \$37 made out to Fayla Reiss Designs for the materials. She will be supplying

(silk, rovings and Tinkerbell) to make a silk scarf. (Note: This fee does not include the felting tool and brush you will need.)

-Needle Felting Tools- Just like you would bring knitting needles to a workshop, there are two tools that are used for this technique. Many of you already have them, but for those that do not, they can be purchased at our local yarn stores or we have found them at a discounted price on-line. See details below. Some have offered to let Guild Members borrow their tools, so see Page 1 for details on that. (Fayla will also have a limited supply of the tool and brush which will be \$34.)

# Purchasing The Needle Felting Tools:

You will need two products. The most common manufacturer is Clover. 1) Needle Felting Mat (we suggest the large size 6 ¼" x 4 ½") \$17.49-\$12.99. 2) Needle Felting Tool (sharp needles so be careful) \$16.49-\$12.49.

### Local Knit Shops-

Please contact your local knitting store to make sure they have the Needle Felting materials you may need. Not all shops carry these products. A complete list of knitting shops is located on our web site at: <a href="https://www.ncknits.com">www.ncknits.com</a>.

#### Purchase On the Internet-

The two tools are made by Clover and they seem to be offered at a discount. Order right away if you want them in time for the Workshop on Wednesday, November 4<sup>th</sup>. # **→ SHARING AT OCTOBER MEETING**

We print abbreviated summaries of shared items which provide enough information to allow you to follow up on items you might like to knit. If you share an item during the monthly sharing, it cannot be worn in the Holiday Luncheon fashion show. Shared items MUST BE FINISHED --- unless it's near Christmas when the rules are relaxed so that you can share an item before it's shipped off to its recipient.

Amy Sheridan: Cardigan- Minimalist Cardigan from Interweave Knits Fall '07. Rust colorway, using Karabella Superwash Merino yarn.

**Stacy Smith:** *Shawl-* Amaretto Gold by Jane Sowerby. Yarn was Malabrigo Lace and she used the Melon Stitch.



Masumi Aycock: Three Cardigans- Masumi presented three different cardigans. For one the yarn was recycled from Irene Fisher sweater, and the other two were machine knit. One was a natural color, and the other two were coral. One had used a linen yarn, one was cashmere, and the third was Merino Wool.

**Rosie Berkowitz**: *V-Neck Cardigan*- Eileen Adler's pattern in a creamy yellow. The yarn was Brown Sheep in a 80/20 cotton, merino "cotton fleece".



Lois Friedlander- Cardigan- From Knitter's Magazine, Summer of 2005. Colorway was light blue, in 100% wool sports weight. Buttons were purchased at Michael's and were probably for children's garments but she liked them so much.



**Liz Knapp-** <u>Shawl-</u> This pattern was a free download called Mara. The colorway was plum and the yarn was Filati Deluxe "Francia". This is new yard that has never been distributed in the US before. She purchased it in a shop in Chula Vista. (Visit our web site for a listing of all yarn shops in the area.) <u>Socks-</u> Pattern was also a free download, called Jaywalker, done in blue and green using Regia Jacquard. A great vacation knitting project!

**Cia Bullemer-** *Cardigan Vest-* Pattern is Kim Hargreaves Nectar book. Colorway was Red, using Frog Tree Pima Cotton. Pattern was a short sleeve, but she got bored and did sleeveless.



**Evelyn Bareno-** *Shawl-* Pattern was from Luna Moth, colorway was blue, green and black. Yarn was Schaefer Anne and the pattern was free!



**Tricia Thompson**- Sweater and Baby Blue Jeans-These were her own pattern for a 3 year old. The white and silver sweater is a Princess Cardigan for Halloween and was a mix of balls from stash. Baby jeans are a successful experiment with cone yarn.



**Barbara McCroskey-** Short Sleeved Sweater- Pattern was Berroco "Valpuri" using Rowan "Summer Tweed". This was 70/30 silk and cotton. Not slippery but difficult to frog as no elasticity.

**Siobhan Rosenberg**- *Scarf*- The pattern was from Martha Stewart. It is a take-off from an ascot design which just sits around the neck and one side has a small slit so that one end slips thru the other. Colorway was blue with little specks of tan. Yarn was Gedifra Riana Wool. She made this for her trip to Ireland. Wanted to make something that would keep her warm without being a bulky scarf.

# Ravelry and Errata

Contributed by: Crazy Crocheter-Monday July 7,2008 from her blog.... I discovered Ravelry. After giving it just a quick glance I understand why most of the knitting (and as it turns out not only knitting) people are using it. I will try to dedicate a separate blog post to Ravelry, for now I just want to share a piece of important information I found. Remember my Reverse Psockology socks? It turns out there is an errata for the pattern. As Anne Pattigrew, the creator of this pattern, mentions on her blog:

it is difficult to get the holes formed by the yarn-overs the same size because of the transition between knit and purl stitches

I remember noticing it when working on my pair but I did not know if it was "normal" or if it happened because of my uneven knitting style, after all it was my first pair of socks. For those of you who are working on these, here you can find a different version of the lacy pattern.

### **How Do YOU Use Ravelry?**

### Guild Member Linda Erlich shares her insights....

I haven't figured out how use a digital camera and upload everything to my computer, so I have no projects listed on my Ravelry Profile. I don't input anything into Ravelry, but I sure take a lot out. I guess you could say I mooch from others' experiences.

Before I start any knitting project from a pattern, I check to see who else has already made it. If folks say this pattern was" impossible", or "I frogged it four times", I abandon it and look for something else to knit. Why go through that kind of aggravation? Knitting is supposed to be fun and relaxing!

It is also a great way to use stash yarn. You know that yarn you bought ten years ago because is was oh, so yummy? Well, just type it in and most likely hundreds of projects will

appear made out of that yarn. Instantly, you have all kinds of suggestions for how to use your yarn that has been sitting in your closet for years! So give it a try and become a moocher like me!!!

# **Guild Member Heather Broadhurst shares her insights too...**

When I first heard about Ravelry, I figured it was just the latest "it" thing that would catch people's attention for awhile before they moved onto to the next fad.

Although I knew a lot of people who were spending a lot of time seemingly entering every knitting needle, every ball of yarn and the progress of every knitting project they had going, I really didn't see the point and had more than enough online things going on/taking my time so I was a bit of a hold out until a trip to Ohio and an encounter with designer Shannon Okey (aka knitgrrl) convinced me that I needed to rethink my opinion.

Since that time, my relationship with Ravelry has continued to evolve and I've become a Ravelry Evangelist.... spreading the news and paying forward the excellent advice Shannon gave me. While I still haven't inventoried all my knitting needles and printed out a little card to show what I own, I've recently been making some in roads into doing an inventory of my Stash.

There's a mix of mooch and contributing in that effort. The mooch part comes from the fact that if some other member of the Ravelry community has entered the information for the yarn I don't have to enter gauge, fiber content, yardage, etc. I simply type in the name of the yarn, the manufacturer and take advantage of someone else's entry.

When the information isn't in there, I can consult my copies of Valuable Knitting Information to enter the details on, for example, that Melrose Silk Supremo and build the knowledge base for others.

As I said, my Ravelry experience is evolving and that evolution continues and I promise to write more in newsletters to come. I also invite you to share your Ravelry experience -- what small part of the big picture are you using, what part do you want to explore and what part do you just not get/understand?
