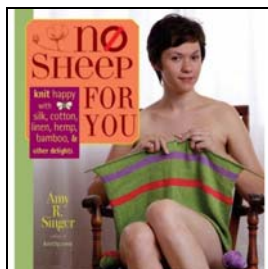

SPECIAL GUEST: AMY SINGER, Book Author and Editor of Knitty.com (little purls of wisdom), will be with us for a lecture/trunk show on "No Sheep for You" followed by 1 full day and one 1/2 day of workshops!

Note: For Non-Members of our Guild, there will be a \$5.00 fee for guests attending the Meeting and a higher price for Workshops as well. This is due to the fact that we are flying her in from Toronto.



Amy explores so much in this book. Yarns made from plant fibers, modern synthetics, and silk take the spotlight in this collection of 21 classic knitting patterns for socks, scarves, hats, bags, vests, sweaters, and even a luxurious bathrobe. Some knitters are discouraged by the thought of baggy hemp sweaters and droopy cotton socks when they consider vegetable fibers, but this authoritative, fun, and light-hearted guide promises that, while wool has no equal when it comes to elasticity and warmth, the right tricks and techniques produce non-wool fashions that fit well, wear well, and hang beautifully. Knitters are taught to knit swatches to study the behavior of a yarn, to choose an appropriate pattern, and to master techniques for reinforcing stitches and inserting knit-ins of springier yarn to keep cotton, silk, and other fibers from sagging.

WORKSHOPS:

Wednesday, Feb 3, 9a.m. – 2p.m., fee \$20-Members and \$40 for Non-Members: Plug-and-Play Shawl Design Class:

Amy will give you a simple plug-and-play manual that will let you turn sock yarn, or any other fingering-weight yarn into something gorgeous. Triangles and rectangular wrap options are offered, and the lace patterns are guaranteed easy-but-beautiful. This class provides the basis for designing your own lace shawl. Max. 15 students.

Supplies: 600-800 yds of fingering-weight yarn – suggestions include wool blended with silk, bamboo or tencel, pure silk, alpaca, cashmere, tencel blends, bamboo. If using multiple skeins they should be in the same colorway or in complimentary colorways. The more variegated your yarn is, the more solid the lace pattern you choose for the shawl will need to be. Tone-on-tone or semi-solids show lace patterning off the best. A good selection of needles in sizes 5,6,7,8,9 (circulars), a big pile of simple ring stitch markers (at least 25), a pad of graph paper and a pencil/eraser. No homework required.

Thursday, Feb 4, 9:00am-11:30am, fee \$10 for Members and \$30 for Non-Members: Tuscany

Shawl Class: Amy will introduce you to the joys of knitting lace the easy way. If you can confidently knit and purl, make yarn-overs, cast on and bind off, you're ready for this project! You will learn all the tricks that make knitting lace a pleasure, and the easy way to block your finished shawl. Max. 15 students.

Supplies: *No Sheep for You* book, # 6 circular (40") recommended, 24 stitch markers (simple rings are best). If you are not going to use the suggested yarns (Handmaiden Silken or Handmaiden Sea Silk), you will need to swatch your yarn before you come to class. Please use a needle 1-2 sizes larger than called for on the ball band. You will to achieve a loose, flowy stockinette, but there should be no visible holes. Whatever size needles produces this fabric with your chosen yarn, please bring those needles to the class.

Homework: Students must complete up to the end of row 7 in the Tuscany Shawl pattern, ready to start row 8.

Early in January, yarn store owners and yarn company representatives gathered in Long Beach for the annual winter trade show of TNNA (The National Needlework Association). This "to-the-trade" show highlights the warm weather yarns and styles that are perfect almost all year round in our climate.

The floor of the show is a kaleidoscope of colors and sensory overload for those of us who can't pass by a beautiful yarn without touching it. Through the blur, two things jumped out at me that are relevant to North Coast Knitters.

- 1) Front and center at the Skacel booth was Cia Bullemer's stunning polka dot sweater. Those of you who were at the December luncheon will remember that Cia and her daughter Abby modeled this style in two different colorways. Snoop that I am, I turned the display sweater inside out and can tell you that the inside of this sweater was as beautiful as the outside.
- 2) Yarn companies are continuing to develop new blends of yarns; a laceweight alpaca and cotton blend was one that caught my eye. Amy Singer, one of the industry's mavens on non-wool yarns, will be our guest speaker at this month's meeting. She's the author of "No Sheep for You" and the one to ask about these new yarns that will appear soon at our local yarn stores. (Amy is also the co-author of "Big Girl Knits" and "More Big Girl Knits" and editor of knitty.com.)

Liz Knapp spoke about our ongoing philanthropy projects of red and pink scarves and helmet liners. The Guild will provide patterns and yarn for these projects. Member Judy Maddox knitted 69 red scarves in honor of her sister. Liz will continue to collect red and pink scarves and helmet liners but would like suggestions for other worthy charities. Colleen Davis distributed

bookmarks listing programs for 2010 by month. Our next meeting will feature Amy Singer who will present a lecture and trunk show. She will also teach two workshops. (Non-members will be requested to pay a \$5.00 fee to attend the meeting.) Colleen also talked about the July Tea Party Challenge that will be coordinated by Susan Ludwig. Maggie Wilson, President of the San Diego Guild, announced the passing of our long time member Esther Malkoun. There will be a memorial service for Esther at the Poway Senior Center on Monday, January 25th at 1:00pm.

Barbara introduced our guest speaker, Tanya Alpert, owner of Knitting by the Beach in Solana Beach. Tanya recently published a book of original designs; "Haiku Knits", which includes 25 patterns inspired by Japanese fashion trends. A trunk show featuring these simple but sophisticated garments was included in her presentation. A book signing followed.

And a special thank you to Susan Ludwig who stepped in to interview and assist Tanya with her presentation. It made all the difference. Thank you Susan!

Linda Erlich conducted a very entertaining and inspiring Show and Share which showcased the amazing talents of many of our members.

✦ SHARING AT JANUARY'S MEETING

We print abbreviated summaries of shared items which provide enough information to allow you to follow up on items you might like to knit. If you share an item during the monthly sharing, it cannot be worn in the Holiday Luncheon fashion show. Shared items MUST BE FINISHED --- unless it's near Christmas when the rules are relaxed so that you can share an item before it's shipped off to its recipient.

Susan Johanson - Sweater knit using the *Diamond Patch* pattern from the book "Just One More Row". Yarn used was Berroco Latitude.



Shirley Weitzman - Cardigan knit using *Sunday Brunch* pattern in green colorway. The yarn used was Brown Sheep Serendipity Tweed. (60% cotton 40% wool)



Mary Kay Ryan – Purse and pillow knit in purple colorway. The purse is made of an old sweater and an old afghan. Pillow is of her granddaughter's kittys.

Linda Erlich – Shawlette in off white colorway with a multi-color ruffle. The pattern is *Ruffled Shawlette* from Foxyknits.com. Yarn is Koigu Fingering weight.

Elizabeth Primrose-Smith – A shell knit using Marianne Isager's *Zig Zag Top* pattern. Yarn Paton's Grace in Wasabi colorway. 100% cotton. Note: Construction very interesting.

Lyn Wogsberg – Children's backpack using Blue Hippo pattern.

Donna Royal – Pullover using *Ridge Waves* pattern from "Knitter's Magazine." Used Jeanne yarn by Plymouth in Seafoam colorway. Note: Garter ridges shaped with increases/decreases.



Nancy Muschek – Sweater using mitered squares. Yarns used Knit One Purl Too Ty-Dy Wool. Note: Yarn has long color changes.

Stacy Smith – Three Felted Bows made with wool yarn. Shawl using *Crazy Lace* pattern. Used Art Fibers yarn and added beads.

Susan Ludwig – Assymetrical Wrap using a pattern from the Vogue Holiday 2007 magazine. Yarn used was Lamb's Pride Worsted in Brown Heather.

Sueko Duckwiler – Shawl using silk yarn.



Robin McNeil – Shoulder Wrap knit in Noro. Pattern *Schadfer Shoulder Wrap*. Added a ruffle to bind off edge.

Mary Brown – Cardigan knit using *Skif Martha* pattern. Purple, grey, and taupe colorway in Habu linen rafia and other Habu yarns. Asymmetrical design.



Louise Anderson – Sleeveless Shell in white yarn. Pattern was from Berroco. Yarn used Paton's Angora (55% bamboo, 35% wool, 10% angora).



Beverly Stone – Hobby Horse using an Ann Bud pattern from Interweave Knits "Knitted Gifts" book. Knit in 100% wool. Scarf using *Ruffled Ascot* pattern. Yarn used was Sensations Flounce in red and black. Ruffle accent a point of interest.

Cia Bullemer – Ruffle Scarf in Blue Sky Pink colorway. Pattern *Churchmouse*. Yarn used Pagewood Farm Glacier Bay 100% superwash merino wool. Hat knit using pattern *Cloche* from Boutique Knits. Yarn used Louet Gems Chunky. Knit in three colors to match a coat – someday!



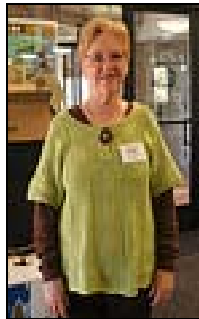
Joyce Raymer – Sweater using a pattern from Sally Melville's "The Purl Book". Joyce is a new knitter and this project was Joyce's first sweater!

Barbara Levin - Three Scarves. The first scarf was from Tanya's book "Haiku Knits". Knit in Habu black yarns. The second scarf was multi-directional and was knit from yarn purchased at Knitting in La Jolla. The third scarf Ruffled Fichu was knit from yarn purchased on a trip to Canada.

- [Hat Box Foundation](#) - handknit and crocheted hats for patients of all ages undergoing chemotherapy. Hats may be any color or style as long as they're washable and SOFT. This charity is in Carlsbad, CA.
- [HeartScarves Project](#) - handknit and crocheted red scarves distributed in hospitals and rehabilitation centers to women undergoing or recovering from cardiac procedures. In memory of her sister, one of our members has

already made more than twenty scarves for this wonderful charity!

- [Operation Sam Helmet Liners](#) - handknit of 100% superwash wool from a standard pattern, these garments fit under the helmets worn by our military troops on the front lines. Cia Bullemer's son is deployed to Afghanistan, where winter temperatures are near freezing.

The Guild will provide yarn in the form of pre-packaged kits with yarn and pattern provided. You can sign out a kit and bring the finished item back the next month. Deadlines apply! The fourth charity is [Navy-Marine Corps Relief Society](#). The NMCRS office at Naval Base San Diego needs handknit, crocheted or quilted baby blankets. The blankets are given to expectant military parents who attend a "Budget for Baby" class in which they learn sound financial practices. I have been a volunteer knitter at NMCRS since 2004 and have a strong personal connection to the organization. They supply acrylic yarn (worsted or fingering weight) if you prefer not to use your own stash. I have many baby blanket patterns in my personal library, or find a new favorite in a book from our Guild library.

• Heart on a String Hat

Available in baby, child and adult sizes, this hat is a quick knit at a gauge of 3st/in on #11 needles. The heart is knit on double points and attached to the hat.

• Circus Striped Socks

Bored with your usual sock patterns? Try this – a garter st cuff knit flat from scraps of sock weight yarn. Finish with your favorite generic sock pattern.

• Baby Professor Vest

This baby vest is knit with worsted weight yarn on #8 needles from the bottom up. It is wider at the bottom than at the shoulders to accommodate a baby's shape.

• Mochi Plus Swirl Hat

This garter stitch hat is a change of pace from the usual knit-in-the-round hat. It begins with a long strip of garter knitting which is seamed and forms the base for the top of the hat.



The pattern calls for #10 needles and includes instruction for adjusting sizing.

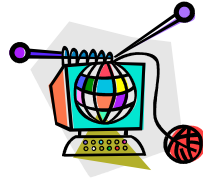
