+ PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE......



FROM BARBARA LEVIN

In the early 1980s when I first volunteered for a non-profit group, I broke down and bought what was then state-of-the-art technology: an answering machine. I was frustrated by having to repeatedly make calls to other volunteers who did not have answering machines, and I did not want to pass that aggravation along to people trying to reach me.

Communication continues to become faster and more complex. I'm old enough to remember when IBM Selectrics with correcting tapes were the hot new thing, when faxing replaced overnight delivery and when Xeroxing finally tolled the death knell for carbon paper (remember trying to correct three smudged copies?).

Now not only do I have email accounts, I reach my friends through Twitter and Facebook, IM and texting. I'm not wildly enthusiastic about some of these techniques, but I use them because they are the best way to communicate with certain people I want to reach.

I bring this all up because of the misunderstanding many members have over delivery of the Guild's newsletter. If we have your email address, we will send the newsletter to you electronically unless you send an email (no phone calls, please) to Sheri Fisher (<u>sherirob1@aol.com</u>) saying you need a paper copy.

There are many reasons for this. Emailed newsletters:

- Allow us to print longer newsletters because we are not restricted by the 8pages limit for cheap postage.
- Allow you to get your newsletter sooner and more securely (and in color).
- Allow you to reach photos and free patterns on-line with one click.
- Allow you the choice of reading and saving your newsletter either in your computer or by printing it out.

- Allow us to use funds for programs instead of printing and mailing costs. Last month's newsletter cost \$176.
- Free up volunteers from timeconsuming tasks of folding and addressing hundreds of copies.

As long as I am president (10 more months and counting) and the board agrees, the Guild will continue to mail newsletters to those who request them. But before you make that request, remember the fate of carbon paper and typewriter ribbons and consider switching to a newer technology. There may come a day in the not-too-distant future when the newsletter is only available on-line. This is neither a threat nor a promise –merely an observation on how quickly the world changes. HIGHLIGHTS OF THE PAST MEETING San Diego North Coast Knitters General Membership Meeting Tuesday, February 2, 2010 - 12:30 p.m. Barbara Levin presiding 153 members and guests present



President Barbara Levin opened the meeting by welcoming a record-breaking number of members and guests. The room was packed! Sara Stolz reminded members about our April in-house program; the Knitted Skirt Fashion Show. Colleen Davis reminded members about The Tea Party Challenge scheduled for the July meeting. Susan Ludwig will be collecting your creations at the June meeting. Liz Knapp announced that philanthropy kits for helmet liners and scarves were available. Jo-Ellen Gould announced plans for the Knitting Retreat at Casa de Maria, May 24 - 27th.

Barbara introduced our guest speaker, Amy Singer, editor of Knitty.com and author of "No Sheep for You".





Linda leads the "sharing" with her beautiful shawl.

Marianne Nolan – *Pullover* knit in Wool Rayon yarn in coral colorway. Pattern: Stock ': Knit. Crochet detail on the sleeves and bottom.



Josephine Needleman – *Coat* knit in an original, patchwork pattern using 100% organic cotton multicolor yarn. The coat is all handknit patchwork with lace. This garment won a Blue Ribbon at the 2009 Los Angeles County Fair in Pomona! Congratulations, Josephine



Linda Erlich – Shawl knit using the Diagonal Shawl pattern from Vivian Hoxbro's Shadow Knitting Book. Yarn used was Harrisville Shetland Wool in four colorways.

Vivian Forseth – Celtic Poncho using the Celtic Poncho pattern by Nicki Epstein in Rowan yarn. The pattern uses triangles sewn into squares.



Amy came all the way from Toronto, Canada to offer a presentation/lecture/trunk show on alternatives to wool varn. She has become an expert on the subject because she is allergic to wool, loves to knit, and was strongly motivated to research wool substitutes. She explained that there were five Fiber families; Bast (linen,hemp), Seed (cotton,kabok), Protein (silk), Synthetic (acrylic,nylon) and Manufactured Natural Fibers (rayon,bamboo corn, soy). She emphasized the importance of gauge, texture and weight when substituting for wool. She strongly recommended making a swatch in stockinette at least 8 inches square and to measure gauge after binding off, and to always read yarn labels very carefully. Amy was an animated and informative speaker. A question and answer session followed her presentation.

Linda Erlich conducted a diverse and inspiring Show and Share.

Shared items MUST BE FINISHED --- unless it's near Christmas when the rules are relaxed so that you can share an item before it's shipped off to its recipient. **Lyn Wogsberg – Serape** knit using the Directional Textured Serape pattern. Yarn used was wool 127 Print in purple colorway. The pattern utilizes squares and rectangles.



Robin McNeil – Gauntlests knit in Noro Taiyo yarn. The pattern is from this month's issue of Knitscene magazine, however, Robin completely changed the wrist and thumb.



Betty Gregory – *Christmas Stockings* using red, green, white, and blue Encore and leftover yarn.



Lois Friedlander – *Sweater* using Ideal Knits Summer 2008 pattern in red yarn. *Shawl* using Shawlette pattern in gray yarn. All yarn used was purchased at the stash sale.





Lisa Limber – Short Jacket using her own pattern design. Yarn used was Jade Sapphire 2-ply Mongolian Cashmere in green/gold colorway. *Kimono* using Chrysanthemum pattern from Tanya's new book. Yarn used was Punta Yarns Merisoft merino and kid mohair in brick colorway. *Shawl* using Aestlight Shawl pattern from Ravelry. Yarn used was Schaefer Nicole DK Superwash sock yarn (merino/nylon) in gold colorway. *Modeled by Linda, who did not want to return the items!*





Donna Royal – *Pullover* using Mitered Magic pattern from Creative Knitting September 2009 issue. Yarn used was Poems by Wisdom Yarns in Key West colorway.



Rosie Halvorson – Boho Beret using the Boho Beret pattern from the Yarn Lady. Yarn used was Trendsetter Yarns Tonalita.



Evelyn Bareno – Shawl using Curved Shawl with Diamond Edging pattern from the Victorian Lace Today book. Yarn used was Jaeger Matchmaker merino 4-ply in pink colorway and size 3.25 needle.



Sandy Yayanos – *Child's Socks* using the 2-at-a-time Socks book by Melissa Morgan-Oakes. Yarn used was Plymouth in multi colorway. *Diamond Caplet* using pattern from Vogue Holiday 2009 and trinity stitch. Yarn used was Zealana Rimu 60% Merino wool 40% possum fibre which is machine washable.



Ellen Hesterman – Scarves using leftover scraps of yarn. No knitting involved and takes 10 minutes to assemble.

Melody Wagner – Doll using Jean Greenhouse pattern and Red Heart yarn, Winchell Donut doll.



Amy Sheridan – Cardigan using Girl Friday pattern from Knitty.com. Yarn used was Merino from kitchensinkdyeworks.com in teal colorway.



Barbara Funkenstein – Sweater using Mr. Greenjeans pattern from knitty.com. Yarn used was Noro Kuryeon.



Masumi Aycock – Long Cardigan using her own pattern. Yarn used was Rowan's Kid Silk and Kid Night in black with metallic. Size 9 needle. Used glass beads at the bottom for weight and crystal beads around neck for decoration.



Kathy Glendinning (in center and friends)– Scarf using Frivola polyester yarn in purple colorway.



Patt, Eileen and Laura Brubaker-*Scarf* These were made in one hour with Pagewood Farm Handspun Bouquet which is a felted yarn, with small felt flowers and leaves tied onto the felted yarn. Fun to work with. Laura used size 35 needles and Eileen and Patt used size 19 needles.

+ Philanthropy

In 2010 the Guild will support FOUR charities. We will continue to support three existing charities:

- <u>Hat Box Foundation</u> handknit and crocheted hats for patients of all ages undergoing chemotherapy. Hats may be any color or style as long as they're washable and SOFT. This charity is in Carlsbad, CA.
- <u>HeartScarves Project</u> handknit and crocheted red scarves distributed in hospitals and rehabilitation centers to women undergoing or

recovering from cardiac procedures. In memory of her sister, one of our members has already made more than twenty scarves for this wonderful charity!

- Operation Sam Helmet Liners handknit of 100% superwash wool from a standard pattern, these garments fit under the helmets worn by our military troops on the front lines. Cia Bullemer's son is deployed to Afghanistan, where winter temperatures are near freezing.
- <u>Kits-</u>The Guild will provide yarn in the form of pre-packaged kits with yarn and pattern provided. You can sign out a kit and bring the finished item back the next month. Deadlines apply! Use your own pattern if you prefer. There are links to many free patterns on the Hat Box web page:

 The fourth charity is <u>Navy-Marine Corps Relief</u> <u>Society</u>. The NMCRS office at Naval Base San Diego needs handknit, crocheted or quilted baby blankets. The blankets are given to expectant military parents who attend a "Budget for Baby" class in which they learn sound financial practices. I have been a volunteer knitter at NMCRS since 2004 and have a strong personal connection to the organization. They supply acrylic yarn (worsted or fingering weight) if you prefer not to use your own stash. I have many baby blanket patterns in my personal library, or find a new favorite in a book from our Guild library.

✦ How I Use Ravelry...

I use Ravelry all the time...to look for new patterns, to see what others have done with either the pattern, or varn that I have or am thinking of getting. I have my projects page with most projects photographed. (I'm AmySheri on Ravelry). I'm also in a Mystery Sock KAL (Knit A Long) in a group called Fans of Through the Loops--the designer has a blog called Through the Loops, and as of now more than 500 Ravelers are doing the socks! It is really fun. You get a clue each Thursday (posted on the designer's website at 12:01 Eastern time, so in San Diego, we get it at 9:01pm and can get started). So far we have done the cuff, the heel, the leg and are now on the foot. The last clue will be the toe.
