Presidents' Letter

Two years ago in our first Presidents' Letter we wrote about how excited we were to lead this wonderful organization, the San Diego North Coast Knitters Guild. We saw a vibrant and growing knitting community, and anticipated that it would get even better. With our term coming to a close this month, we could not be more proud of the accomplishments of the Guild.

Some numbers show how successful the Guild has been. Membership is at an all-time high of 337 knitters. Most returning members renew in January; last year new members joined each and every month. (Speaking of renewals, now is the time to renew for 2015. See the last page for a 2015 Membership Form.) Although we are geographically linked to the North Coast area of San Diego, the Guild has several out-of-state members and a sizable contingent from outside San Diego county. We all know what our traffic is like and that makes it all the more impressive to consistently see members from Riverside county, from Orange county and from Los

Angeles county at monthly meetings. The San Diego North Coast Knitters Guild is truly a "destination" Guild!

Membership alone does not fully convey the success of the Guild. Members participate. Monthly meetings buzz with about 150 knitters in attendance. About one in six members took a workshop last year. Even more members have learned from their peers during Members Teaching Members Workshops (MTM). We've been edified and entertained by topics as diverse as color theory, knitting birds, basic crochet, new increases and decreases, reusing knitted garments and eco-dying and printing. Still more members learn from each other informally at Guild subgroups and Guild retreats. Later this month at our retreat in Temecula, 32 Guild knitters will convene to share their love of knitting.

Numbers and statistics and lists don't however fully explain the vibrancy of the Guild. We are all excited when a member shares a newly completed garment during our monthly Show and Share, and all around the room people are saying, "I think I can make that" and "I could make that" and "I want to make that in another yarn" and "I want to make that, only with different sleeves" and "I want to make that...." All around people are looking at the garment and leaning over to touch, to ask questions and to ask the pattern name one more time. The room is showered with sparks of creativity. Members are inspiring others to take on a new knitting challenge. This is the Guild all members can be proud of.

We have learned much from all of you. We have been inspired to knit and now will have a bit more time to do that. We may have to put some things on hold since we will both become grandmas in the coming months. We will be knitting new and exciting small projects for new additions yet to be born but already anticipated and loved. We encourage all of you to continue to be inspired by the Guild, by the generosity and talent of its members, by each other.

Jane knits and designs patterns that feature a mix of fabulous yarn rather than complex pattern work. Take a look at her work at www. ianethornlev.com or on Ravelry (color4texture) and be amazed at her mastery of color and texture.

Jane will be at the February 3 meeting to talk about "Inspired Designs." She will teach a full-day workshop, "Consider the Possibilities," from 9 am to 4 pm Wednesday, February 4. She will repeat the same workshop Thursday, February 5, so that as many members as possible will have a chance to take advantage of her visit. The cost for each full-day workshop is \$50. Guild subsidies make this bargain price possible for you.

All you need is an assortment of yarns of various colors and textures and a willingness to experience knitting "off the grid." As Jane puts it, "Every knitter has the ability to create unique works of fiber art once they trust that inner voice."

Signups will begin at the January meeting. The size of the workshops is limited so don't miss out. Thanks to member Linda Bruno for suggesting Jane Thornley as a guest speaker for our Guild.

Minutes of the SDNCKG Meeting November 4, 2014

Sheila Kirschenbaum welcomed members and special guests, knitters from Seacrest who have knitted scarves and hats to support our philanthropy programs.

A used book sale preceded today's program and was followed by Guild business:

The Holiday Luncheon and Fashion show will be held on December 1 at Morgan Run and fifty reservations are still available. A registration form is in the newsletter and on the website. Thirty knitters have signed up for the retreat in Temecula and payment is due at the January Guild meeting. Contact June Bartczak for more information.

At the January 6 meeting Sara Stoltz will present an insider's take on "Yarn Bombing".

Marie Fisher will be the sage advisor for the Help Session on Tuesday, November 11.

Sara Smelt was going to present a Felted Lariat Class on November 10 but the class was cancelled for lack of sign-ups.

Sue Tavaglione presented information about future "Members Teaching Members" programs. In November Sara Stoltz will teach her "Knitted Birds" workshop and Laura Cunitz will teach her new increase techniques for hats. Karen des Jardins will offer a class on sewn project bags, and a beginning crochet class will be offered in December. See the newsletter for time, location and materials needed for each of these workshops.

Philanthropy Chair Arlene Shaposhnick announced that the Guild has given 50 hats to Tête-à-Tête Hats and 50 to Operation Gratitude. She thanked members for their generous donations. She also introduced her committee who prepared bags, decorated with knitted hearts and flowers, containing yarn and hat patterns for members to knit during today's program. The hats will be collected at the December luncheon and meeting in January.

Sheila presented the slate of officers for 2015 to the Guild.

Dottie Pusl from the Braille Institute, shared information about the knitting program offered there and thanked the Guild for yarn donations that have been sent to them. Examples were shown of the projects made by knitters who have macular degeneration. Many charities benefit from the creations: red scarves are given to recent heart surgery patients, the homeless, newborns at Rady

Childrens Hospital and hats and scarves are sent to tribes in Alaska.

Diane Seaberg introduced Richard Nares of the Emilio Nares Foundation.

He talked about the special needs of parents whose children are cancer patients. His foundation offers free transportation to the hospital, in-hospital support for the parents while they are waiting to be with their children, provides nutritious snacks, and will be offering user-friendly shirts especially designed for patients who have ports and need easy access. The program has been designed around the special needs that he and his wife experienced with their own son.

Gabriela Perez-Vargas, Programs Coordinator for the Foundation, shared information about one program at Rady that helps patients and families relieve their stress during trying times. She teaches them to knit, helps find patterns and select yarns.

Taylor De Vries, her mom, Shelly Gerber, and sister, Paige, presented Tête-à-Tête, a knitted hat program originally for teens in the hospital that has grown to be a nationwide project. Hats are given to cancer patients in local hospitals and nationwide organizations. Since 2010, this mother and her two daughters have knitted 2000 hats for charity.

Show and Share was moderated by Sheila. She later adjourned the meeting.

Thank you to all of you who turned in hats and scarves last year; we were able to help many people and put smiles on their faces. Thank you to Karen Henderson from the Black Sheep yarn shop and to Guild member Mary Brown for their yarn donations to Philanthropy.

This year we will be adding a new charity...knitting comfort scarves for abused women in shelters. Many of you have been knitting beautiful scarves that are very suitable as comfort scarves, so I figure why not. We will be working with Handmade Especially For You. This organization wraps up comfort scarves with ribbon and sends them to women's shelters all over California. The need is great. The shelters house women and children who leave home with nothing but the clothes they are wearing. It is a traumatic experience and the scarves are very "comforting." We shipped about 100 hats and scarves to Operation Gratitude in September. These lovely items were included in care packages sent in December to our overseas military women and men. We will continue to collect items for next year's care packages. Please remember to use subdued colors and include the fiber content on an attached gift tag.

Lastly, we will still be knitting hats and scarves for the Oz program for the homeless kids in San Diego county. We will be collecting these all year so we will have enough for the winter.

April Fashion Show

It's not too soon to start thinking about our April Challenge and Fashion Show: Vintage Revisited. The challenge is to use a vintage pattern to create a new piece. You could adapt or reinterpret the pattern, use just one feature (like a lace collar) or rework it on larger needles (so you don't need a corset underneath).

If you picked up some old magazines at our Guild library sale in November, you have a head start. Other sources of vintage patterns include your local library (where knitting books often sit on the shelves for decades).

To find vintage patterns on Ravelry, go to the pattern browser and type "vintage patterns" in the search box. You can filter the results using the pull-down menus in the left-hand column (Category, Availability, Craft, Attributes, and so on). The Ravelry Wiki lists numerous online sources here: ravelry.com/wiki/pages/OutOfPrintSources

For a trip into knitting's distant past, try Franklin Habit's Knitty column, "Stitches in Time" knitty.com/archiveSIT.php.
