Jean DegenfeJean Degenfelder of Jean's Handwovens is a local handweaver and designer with a passion for color and fiber. Her one-of-a-kind jackets, shawls, bags, capes and specialty garments are infused with hues



that can be rich, bright, and vibrant, or more subtle and muted. Jean blends cottons, rayon chenille,

Tencel and silk in her work. Once she has created the cloth, its size and texture helps determine what garments she will create.

Jean began weaving in 1994. She holds a Bachelor of Arts degree in Clothing and Textiles from San Diego State University, and she has continued her training at fiber workshops, seminars and conferences in the United States and in Europe and Asia.

At the November meeting Jean will share her adventures collecting textiles around the world and show how they have influenced her work and creativity through the years. She'll bring examples of textiles she has collected while on the journey. She'll also describe her experiences learning to make felt in Konya, Turkey, from a fourth-generation master. Joelle Mertzel, the woman who founded the knitting program at the shelter, has purchased all supplies herself and is teaching the women how to knit. She says, "So far they have fallen in love with the hobby and many of them have completed their first project." She is reaching out to the knitting community and found our Guild through The Knitting Guild Association (TKGA) website.

Joelle is looking for any knitting-related donations: good quality yarn, needles of any size, crochet hooks, notions and project bags, etc. Unfortunately, her request came the week following our stash sale and so I share this message with you as individual members. Bring to class: US #1 knitting needles (short double points work well but any type will do), a sharp yarn needle. Supplies (purchase your own or pre-order a kit from me for \$15):



- 10 yds size 5 Crochet Thread (or equivalent)
- 150 size 6.0 beads
- Button, clasp or toggle
- Dental floss threader or beading needle

 This free pattern is available for free for a limited time. Using less than 400 yds of DK weight yarn, it's a stashbuster that makes a great baby shower gift.
- **2** Robin Allen's ingenious <u>City Cowl</u> pattern makes good use of that single skein of luxury worsted yarn. And looks equally appropriate on men and women.

- **3** Go Your Own Way Socks by Stacey Winklepeck is a good basic sock pattern, no matter if you prefer knitting top-down or toe-up. Learn all the techniques using size 2 needles.
- Meet Grace Brett, the 104-year old English woman who <u>yarn-bombed</u> several towns in Scotland. And another <u>yarn bombing article</u> from Brooklyn.

Carol Myers designed "Ronnie's Cowl" as a tribute to her mother Ronnie and all breast cancer patients and survivors. All net proceeds are donated to The Susan G. Komen Race-for-the-Cure. San Diego chapter. Carol's version was knit in Tosh DK superwash wool.

Maire Skillman used Berroco Geode (50% wool/50% acrylic) to crochet the "Sonata Shrug." The long color-change varn that Marie got in the 2013 stash sale is a great choice. The pattern, originally published in Crochetvolution Winter 2011. is available for

free.

Colleen Davis used Kaffe Fasset's motifs to salvage two UFO's (unfinished objects) and create one stunning jacket. She used brocade on the back, and Persian poppies and large polka-dots on the front. Then she added sleeves in shades of grey and orange. By using the magic ball technique for the sleeves. the wedges of color look handpainted. What an inspiration!



Patt Miller modeled her "Color Way" shawl (or was it a large scarf?) in shades of teal, aqua and grey. The design and 100% Superwash Merino yarn is from Baah. The pattern is an easy two-row repeat whose beauty comes from the gradation of seven mini-skeins of yarn.





Dorrit Franke shared her Debbie Bliss-designed knit Kangaroo. She used fingering weight yarn that had been in her stash for 15 years. Although she said the pattern was difficult, the results are terrific.



Sandy Yayanos proudly showed her pullover knit from Trendsetter's Essence yarn (wool/ polyamide/acrylic). Linda Erlich was certain she donated the very same yarn years ago! The sweater was knit from the top down with sleeves and neckline added later.

Susan Shock wore a summer cardigan from Sublime Book #672. The sweater, called "Rally," is so new that is isn't even in the Ravelry database yet! Susan's version was knit in Cascade SunSeeker, a blend of acrylic, cotton and metallic. Susan is holding a cute insideout dinosaur-to-egg tov.

Nathine Nelson showed her "Baby Tree of Life Throw." The Nicky Epstein pattern was knit in Lion Brand's Pound of Love acrylic yarn. What a spectacular baby gift! Nathine's "Magical Stripes Cardigan" is a Red Heart design and was knit in

Red Heart Boutique Magical yarn. The "Bandstand" pullover is a Louisa Harding design and Nathine knit hers in Louisa Harding Anise yarn

(acrylic/cotton/nylon).



Vivian Forseth took the guesswork out of choosing her patterns and yarn. By selecting kits, she ensured that



bottom back, over the shoulders, and down the fronts. Then stitches were picked up at the sides for the inserts. Vivian's notes are here.

The "Santa Fe" (right) sweater from Carol Sunday is a kit with more than 15 different yarns. The designer used the Russian Splice technique for changing colors without the pesky visible jog. This and other technique videos are available for free on the designer's website.

Sydnie Wauson's spicy shawl is the "Cholula Chevrons Shawlette." Heather Boyd designed it after seeing the limited edition Madelinetosh Merino Light colorway called "Mexican Grilled Street Corn." Read more from the designer **here**. It is available for only \$1.00.
