

DAPPLED SUNLIGHT SCARF - corrected copy

MATERIALS:

YARN: one skein (200 yards) of knitting worsted weight yarn

NEEDLES: US 7 (4.5mm), US 8 (5mm), US 9 (5.5mm) or US 10 (6mm) needles

NOTIONS: tapestry needle; 2 stitch markers

SIZE: 5" wide and about 56" long

GAUGE: about 4.5 sts + 6 rows = 1" but gauge isn't critical for this pattern

SKILL LEVEL: Beginner to Easy: **SK2P** double decrease and **yo** (yarn over) eyelet increase

PATTERN NOTES:

Pattern Note 1: count stitches on Row 4 of Dappled Sunlight Pattern

Pattern Note 2: **SK2P:** "slip, k2tog, psso" - slip 1 stitch; then knit the next 2 stitches together; then psso (pass slip stitch over)

DAPPLED SUNLIGHT SCARF:

Cast on 23 stitches

Rows 1 to 7: knit rows = 4 garter stitch ridges

BEGIN DAPPLED SUNLIGHT PATTERN:

Row 1: (k1, p1) 2 times, *k1, yo, k3, yo, k1* repeat from * to * 3 times, end (p1, k1) 2 times; 29 sts

Row 2: (k1, p1) 2 times, p21, (p1, k1) 2 times; 29 sts

Row 3: (k1, p1) 2 times, *k2, SK2P (slip 1, k2tog, psso), k2* repeat from * to * 3 times, end (p1, k1) 2 times; 23 sts

Row 4: (k1, p1) 2 times, p15, (p1, k1) 2 times; 23 sts

Repeat Rows 1 to 4 until 55" from cast on edge.

Last 8 rows: knit - garter stitch

Last RS Row: bind off in knitting on WS

(Options: For a wider scarf, cast on any multiple of 5 stitches + extra stitches for edges; this pattern has 4 edge stitches on each side which are not shown on the chart:

Using any yarn, needles, and gauge, allow for about

5" of width and cast on a multiple of 5 stitches plus selvage garter stitches.)

PARTY FAVOR PATTERNS:

ARLENE'S FLOWER - cast on 12 or any even number of stitches

Row 1: knit

Row 2 and all WS rows: purl

Row 3: *kf&b* in every stitch; total 24 sts

Row 5: *kf&b* in every stitch; total 48 sts

Row 7: *kf&b* in every stitch; total 96 sts

Row 9: Bind off all stitches.

Steam to slightly flatter the flower and sew to desired location. Do not seam the flower but rather overlap the ends to create a round shape. Use one Spot Bobble for the center.



SPOT BOBBLE- Begin with a slip knot, leaving a 6" tail. Make several for a spot bobble flower.

Row 1: k1f&b&f into the same stitch; 3 sts

Row 2: *k1f&b* twice, end k1; 5 sts

Rows 3 and 5: purl

Row 4: knit

Row 6: *k2tog* twice, k1; 3 sts

Row 7: k3tog; end last stitch leaving a 12" tail.

TO FINISH BOBBLE: thread a tapestry needle with the 12" tail and run it along the perimeter of the knitted bobble, ending where you began. Gently pull the yarn closing the bobble but before cinching it tight, wind the 6" cast on tail into a tight ball and stuff it into the bobble. Cinch the yarn tight and attach it wherever you want a bobble. To make a bigger bobble, hold yarn double. Sew bobbles in a circular shape with one bobble in the middle.



LEAF - Cast on 1 stitch. Make 2 leaves.

Row 1: knit into the front, back, and front of the stitch; total 3 sts

Row 2 and all WS rows: purl

Row 3: *k1f&b* twice, end k1; total 5 sts

Row 5: k1f&b, knit 2, k1f&b, k1; total 7 sts

Rows 7 and 9: knit

Row 11: k2, **S2KP**, k2; 5 sts

Row 13: k1, **S2KP**, k1; 3 sts

Row 15: **S2KP**, end last st, leaving a 12" tail.

NOTE: **S2KP** - central double decrease: slip 2 together as if to knit them together, knit the next stitch, pass both slipped stitches over the knitted stitch.

FINISHING: Using the ending tail and the back stitch method, sew down the center stitch of the leaf. Use the cast on tail to secure the beginning end of the leaf. Weave in tails.
