I am in the process of arranging just that for our January Temecula Retreat.



### **Knitting on the Net**









✓ To avoid messy edges and to fix an enlarged last bind-off stitch, get tips from this video at Knitting with Suzanne.









- Making increases in striped knitting is a challenge. This <u>Yarn Geeks Newsletter</u> shows an alternative to KFB that will not show!
- **2** Read about an artist whose yarn installation brings color into the country's largest shopping mall. **13,000 Strands of Yarn Cast a Shimmering Rainbow** inside the Mall of America.
- **3** Autumn Vines Top from DROPS is designed in sizes S to 3X and uses 900-1400 yds of DK weight yarn. Knit in a wool blend, it is a lovely layering piece for the cooler months.
- **<u>Our Ceridwen</u>** is a Berroco shawl pattern that takes 490 yds. of sport yarn knit on US7 needles. A lace pattern is knit lengthwise, then stitches are picked up along the side of the border. Short rows are worked in garter stitch to form the body of this crescent-shaped shawl.
  - **6** <u>Little Shell Top</u> from Classic Elite is a summery top designed for a cotton/bamboo blend sport weight yarn.
- **6** <u>Lindsay's Jacket</u> from Cascade Yarns is a child's hooded cardigan worked in Aran weight yarn, so it's a good project for an adventurous beginner.
- ♠ Andromeda Cardigan is a knitted jacket worked in a circle of garter stitch with a leaf pattern on the back. it is a free from DROPS Design.
  - **8** <u>Premier Cabled Socks</u> use US2 needles and a gauge of 9sts/in.
