**April 4** ROMI HILL: New Lace Knitting: Designs for Wide Open Spaces "When it comes to stunning lace knitting, there are few names

more synonymous with the craft than Romi Hill." Her creations are beautiful, artful, and sophisticated. Knitwear designer Rosemary (Romi) Hill will talk about the incredible versatility of lace: how stitch patterns change in different weights of yarn, and how little details make a lace project truly elegant, whether it is for every day or special occasion.



A lifelong crafter and knitter, she is inspired by natural surroundings and her designs have an organic flow. Her work has appeared in publications such as Vogue Knitting, Interweave Knits, Knitscene and Twist Collective, and in numerous books. Romi's book <u>New Lace Knitting</u> features timeless patterns for garments and accessories.

Romi will teach four workshops and YOUR VOTE is needed (see top of page 2).

#1 Lace & Cable Surgery In this workshop, not only will we discuss techniques to avoid mishaps, bu also participants will learn how to rip a section of lace (or lace and cable) back and knit it up row by row without having to rip the entire project out. Students will be given charted knitting homework to be prepared prior to the class: 2 lace swatches with mistakes (or a lace swatch and a cable swatch with mistakes), to be operated upon during class!

#2 Devilish Details beautiful and successful project always comes down to the details! In this class, students will learn techniques used in "New Lace Knitting" (Interweave, 2015) projects, plus others, including: Kitchener cast on and bind off, provisional crochet cast on to knitting needle, 3-needle bind off, I-cord bind off, knitted on lace edging bind off, grafting, picking up stitches, Russian join, spit splice, joining top of shoulder seams invisibly, and placing beads with a crochet hook. We'll be swatching all of the different techniques.

#3 Knitted Jewelry: Introduction to knitting and crocheting with wire. In this class, students will swatch using different needles and hooks and make a necklace out of their swatches! Materials: wire, beads, double pointed knitting needles. Materials fee applies for wire swatch kit. Swatch with wire and make your swatches into a Mess-up Necklace (pattern from Rosemary Hill's book Elements of Style: Knit & Crochet Jewelry with Wire, Fiber, Felt & Beads).

## Minutes - General Meeting Tuesday, Feb. 7, 2017

Co-President Mary Brown opened the meeting at 1:30 p.m. After greeting new members and guests, Mary introduced Program Co-Chair Karen des Jardins.

Karen des Jardins announced some changes to the classes offered by Romi Hill on April 5. The Silversmith Bath Set class is being replaced with Lace and Cable Surgery, so there will be two classes offered in Lace and Cable Surgery. Karen also reminded everyone that the classes in February and March are being held at the Holiday Inn Express and not at the Church. She encouraged members to sign up for classes. She then introduced speaker Lorilee Beltman who spoke about "Colors that Climb: Vertically Stranded Color Work." Lorilee presented a brief introduction to the technique of vertically stranded color work and lots of creative, colorful ways to incorporate the technique into a variety of projects.

Co-President Mary Brown conducted the business portion of the meeting. She began by announcing that the Guild needs a volunteer to head the Stash Sale. Anyone who is interested in this position should contact either Mary Brown or Laura Brubaker.

Membership Chair Nancy Nevin reported that the Guild membership year is February 1, 2017, through January 31, 2018. Nancy announced Irina Anikeeva received a complementary membership to the Guild as an award from the San Diego County Fair at the Del Mar Fair Grounds. and Marva Ross for knitting Softies in January and February. She also thanked Marva Ross for storing all of the donations until they are delivered and Arlene Shaposhnick who test knits.

Library Co-Chair Scarrain Gomes reported that she and Co-Chair Brigit Pitcairn have instituted a new arrangement for the library collection with new categories. They hope this will facilitate browsing and selecting books. Also, there is a nice selection of giveaway magazines.

Our first free SAK – Share-A-Knit class is
Thursday, April 13, from 10 a.m. to 12 noon at the
Solana Beach Library, 157 Stevens Avenue, Solana
Beach, CA. Please park in the lower parking lot
or on the street to leave the upper parking lot
spaces available for the short-term or physically
handicapped library patrons. We will be knitting MINI
COLOR SPLASH SCARF, a two-tone slip-stitch colorwork pattern. Materials include two colors of knitting
worsted weight yarn, from 200 to 300 yards total, US
size 10 (6mm) or 10.5 (6.5mm), and a tapestry needle
for weaving in ends. The colors look best when
contrasted.

Congratulations to our Softies SAK winners: Lois Chaddock, Susan Schock, Cary Sullivan (two SAKs!), Rebecca Johnson, and Marva Ross. Thank you Marcia Rosenberg and Kim McIntyre for providing the beautiful array of Softies SAKs. Three pairs of Softies equals one Softies SAK . . . and speaking of Softies, bigger is better, so please follow the pattern until each needle has at least 28 stitches before commencing the back shaping. The bigger ones are used as "bust buddies" for women who play sports. It turns out that Softies are very versatile. Yarn for Softies will always be free but please find the free pattern on our website or on Ravelry. Thank you!
