2016 is coming to an end. Here is what I see when I take a look back:

We had our biggest fundraiser in the guild's history with a recordbreaking total of \$4,011 raised at the holiday luncheon. Our stash sale in September raised \$2,218. Our members contributed more than 500 hats and



scarves to San Diego humanitarian organizations this year. We knit Softies and Knitted Knockers — more than 100 pairs! Donated yarn and supplies were passed along to the blind and to families of hospitalized children (who learn to knit and crochet

while keeping their sick kids company). Our knitting made a difference to others near and far. We connected with many people: women with whom we carpooled to Guild meetings, new friends we made while staffing the Guild's display table at the county fair, members who taught MTM classes and those who attended the classes.

I'm so proud of all we've accomplished together. I am proud to say that I belong to the largest (and best, in my opinion) knitting guild on the West Coast. It's been my pleasure to serve as your President for the past two years. Thank you to the Executive Board members, chairwomen, and volunteers who joined me for the fun and hard work. Your talents, dedication, and energy made it easy for me to do my job. I will continue to look forward to our monthly meetings; in 2017 you'll find me sitting in the audience with my charity knitting in hand. I hope I'll see you there too.

Retreat Update

Participation at our annual Winter Retreat to Vina de Lestonnac in Temecula, from January 16-19 2017, has now been reserved by 31 members. The January Retreat is now full. This year the total cost for a single was \$422. For a double it was \$322 per person. These prices are the same as last year. *The final payment is due by the January 10 meeting.*

Our Spring Retreat will be at the Mary and Joseph Retreat Center in Rancho Palos Verdes, NOT at Vina de Lestonnac in Temecula, as previously written. There was a conflict with our meeting date with the Temecula availability. Sorry about that, for those of you who were all set to return to Temecula for a second time in one year!! The dates for this retreat are May 15-18. Singles are \$520.00, and doubles are \$400.00 per person. That includes meals beginning with lunch on Monday, through breakfast on Thursday. For those members who live nearby and would like to join us, there is a daily commuter rate of \$25.00 per person + meals: \$10 breakfast, \$16 lunch, and \$21 dinner. A deposit of \$100.00 per person will hold a double room reservation (you need to have a roommate); a \$150.00 deposit will hold a single room reservation. Daily Commuter fees need to be paid in full before the May 2017 meeting. More details to follow.





- Garter Stripe Baby Socks Quick to knit using fingering weight yarn and USos for a gauge of 8sts=1-inch. The socks feature short row heels and toes, a garter strip in front, and a garter "seam" in the back.
- **2** <u>Urban Necessity Gloves</u> are the perfect accessory for people with busy hands that live in cold climates.
- **3** <u>Bienvenidas Cardigan</u> is a top-down pattern with simple and seamless construction. It is kit in fingering weight yarn on a US#5 needle.
- **Methodology** Is a small doll that knits up quickly in sock yarn on US 1 or 2 needles. It makes

- an adorable baby gift and is a great travel project. Thousands have been created and mailed to children all around the globe through various charitable organizations. Pattern available on Ravelry in its original German, plus English, Dutch, and Danish.
- **Sea Wave Infinity Scarf** is a fun chevron pattern with enough challenge to keep it from being boring.
- **©** <u>Leaf Top</u> from Bernat uses less than 800 yds. of heavy worsted or bulky yarn to create a seamless top-down pullover with leaf detail at the neckline. Easy to lengthen the sleeves or add waist shaping to your liking.
