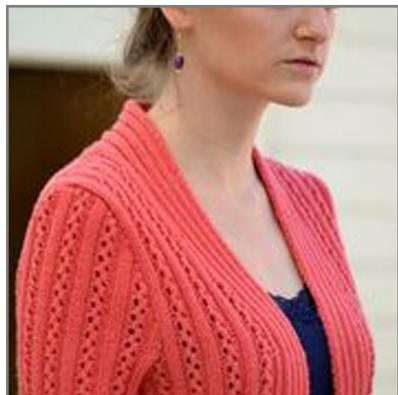

→ Payment in advance will guarantee a seat; pay by cash or check.

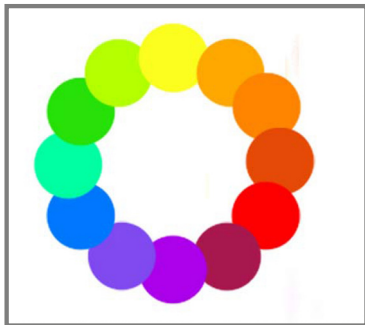
→ Make checks payable to SDNCKG and mail to the Guild treasurer.

Sue Tavaglione's feather and Fan Shawl makes brilliant use of a textured yarn, Interlacements Rick Rack. The 100% rayon yarn is hand dyed and comes in enormous skeins of 1,100 yds. Sue had to set the colors in white vinegar but the result is lovely.

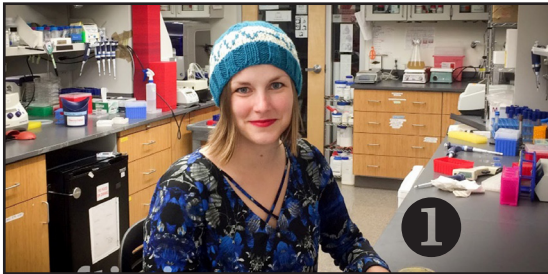

❶ A Postdoctoral Research Scientist named **Heidi Arjes** recently created knit hat designs for the March for Science. Read all about Heidi in the [Stanford News](#) and see her free hat designs at [Project Thinking Cap](#).

❷ Isabell Kraemer's [On the Beach](#) sweater is a great beginner project to take the first step into contiguous set-in sleeves method. The pullover is knit in stockinette to a gauge of 4.5 sts/in. The free pattern is available in English, French, Dutch, Portuguese, and Italian!

❸ [Seas of Jupiter Socks](#) are knit in a self-striping yarn with a contrast color for accent.

❹ Cultured Purl Society offers the [Bubble Wrap Stitch](#). What a fun pattern for a baby blanket!

❺ [Eli-Duett Shawl](#) is a shallow wrap, knit in seed stitch with a deep lace border. The pattern is a free download in English and German.

❻ [Seaside Dream Cardigan](#) from DROPS Design is worked top-down with $\frac{3}{4}$ sleeves and a lace pattern that is both charted and written. The Pattern is sized from S to XXXL.
