

(Second Tuesday) January 9: Heather Walpole "Hues You Can Use: Choose the right colors for your project"

Heather Walpole believes that as knitters and creative

people we often find ourselves drawn to a specific set of colors. If a project calls for three colors of yarn, we can choose them quickly, but how do we choose which color will act as the main color and which of the remaining two colors will play the supporting roles? Visual balance is important during the decision-making process. Heather's program will



provide unique insights into how to choose and use the right colors for a project.

Heather Walpole is the owner and creator of Ewe Ewe Yarns, a small independent yarn company based in Oceanside. Along with starting her own yarn line, Heather is an accomplished knitwear designer, author, and knitting personality. Heather created Ewe Ewe Yarns to be about color and happiness in knitting. Her career began as a graphic designer for

news and ad agencies as well as designing for an international retailer. But she always dabbled in crafts; she did "every handcraft under the sun: drawing, painting, sewing, woodworking and even a little car maintenance!" Creating Ewe Ewe Yarns was the next logical step in her knitting career. Her yarns reflect her love of colors and fibers.



"Meets in the Middle Chevron Shell," (Left to Right) Chris Ward, Susan Johansen, Betty Kemper, Aunrey Bubis. Another of the talented GATE Group Knit-a-Long, this shell/sweater begins at the corners, then you join them as they meet in the middle. Side gussets guarantee a perfect fit without much work but lots of style. The sleeves are optional.



"Plaid is the New Fad," (Left to Right) Sue Tavaglione as model, Wendy Hovis, Ann Hickey, Linda Erlich (not pictured). Wendy's yarn-Baah La Jolla, Stunning String Theory, Cascade Heritage /Manos del Uruguay Fino, Ann's yarn Baah La Jolla, Linda's in Greenwood Fiberworks Sublime, Miss Babs Yummy 2-Ply, & Tess' Designer Yarns Super Socks & Baby. This is a really FUN knit with all the anticipation of how your chosen colors will look knitted up in the pattern.



Co-President Laura Brubaker, "Rain Outside Shawl." Laura found this knitting this Sylvia McFadden shawl very interesting with never a dull moment. Yarns were Mountain Colors Twizzlefoot, Rohrspatz & Wollmeise Lace, Baah La Jolla, Harrisville New England Shetland, and Rowan Kidsilk Haze.



Alice Chary, Stash Sale Coordinator Bobbie Brunson, Marva Ross, "Whippet Cardigan." The Gate group Knit-a-Long powered through this complicated construction with the help and encouragement of each other. Bobbie made her sleeves larger in circumference to make her sweater more comfortable to be worn over a long-sleeve shirt. Yarns used are Geilsk Cotton and Wool, Knit Picks Paragon Sport, Holst Garn Coast.



Vice President Linda Hart, "Sonoma Stole" Kit. This is a crescent shaped stole with wide bias ribs and knit-in fringe. It is worked in two sections and grafted together in the back. Linda became email pals with the designer after Linda discovered that they share the same birthday. After gifting Carole Sunday a design of her own, she was offered a pattern and chose this one. Linda had plans to use stash yarn, but quickly discovered she would need 17 colors.... and caved in and bought the kit.



Program Co-Chair Karen des Jardins, "Midsummer Night Shawl" from designed Olga Bochkareva. Knit in Anzula Breeze and MadTosh Prairie, Karen used 625 beads and added the gray border when she ran out of pink.



"Exploration Station Shawl" by Stephen West. (Left to Right) Barbara Levin, Lupe Smith, Laura Brubaker, Holiday Luncheon Chair Willa Cather, Dolores Rodriguez (not pictured). Willa used Geilsk 2-ply, Dolores used Baah La Jolla, Laura used a wool and silk combination. This top down semi-circle shawl that begins with short rows and yarn overs followed by two-color brioche ribbing, slipped stitches, stripes, and finally a beautiful chevron border. The project is fun because you are always changing stitches and colors before you get bored.



Sharon Dintaman modeled "The Village," designed and knit by Colleen Davis

This capelet was inspired by a photo Colleen saw on Pinterest. It is composed of different shaped houses with colorful windows, doors, and roofs lined up in a row around the bottomt. Using very bright colors in different fibers and textures, the layout reminded Colleen of a village



(Left to Right) Aunrey Bubis, Amy Sheridan, Philanthropy Coordinator Eileen Adler, "Leaving" Cardigan & Pullover by designed Ann Handsen. This is the GATE (Gifted and Talented) group Knit-a-Long. This group got together in 2016 to do a Knit-a-Long and found the experience rewarding and fun. Amy modified the pattern to fit her gauge. Also shorted the sleeves, added more rows of ribbing for neckband, and omitted the rolled edges on sleeves and bottom band. Aunrey and Eileen used different necklines to personalize their pullover versions of the same pattern.



Co-President Mary Brown "All About Angles" cardigan used Bahh La Jolla and other fingering weight yarns. This is Mary's design. She played with angles throughout and used a variety of stitches along with some of Kaffe Fasset's poppies.



Josephine Barkhousen "Red Edge Cardigan" by Anna-Lisa Mannheim Lunn in Brown Sheep Nature Spun wool. This incredible cardigan took Josephine 10 years to knit, on and off. She found the neck front too high and lowered it for a customized fit.





Anna Walden, 2-piece dress. This is the garment Anna designed and knit for the Mesa College and Salk Institute Design and Discovery Fashion Showcase. Each designer who was selected to participate in the program was paired with a scientist from Salk Institute. Anna's scientist is working on a cure for Glioblastoma, a form of brain tumor. This dress is a metaphor for her work. The I-cord embellishment on the lower top and skirt represents the brain folds (see close-up), the crocheted star shapes are astrocytes (brain cells), and the neckpiece is the tumor developing its own blood supply. Anna used Shibui Reed, Great Adirondack ladyslipper, and a collection of fibers including linen and rayon.


