Wendy Hovis' Beeline Shawl is by designer Amanda Sheuzger. This was a test knit before the pattern was released. It is an asymmetrical shawl with slip stitch cables, garter stitch, and lace. Lots of good notes and photos on Wendy's Ravelry page.





Linda Berger and Ginny Newton both showed their Building with Lace Shawls, which starts with basic lace and works toward more challenging stitch patterns. The designer is Michelle Hunter and the yarn is HiKoo Rylie (50% baby alpaca/25% mulberry silk/ 25% linen).

Lois Chaddock's Rhombulus Shawlettes are a great sock yarn and DK yarn stashbuster, and it's FREE!



Sheila Kirschenbaum's Jalousie top is by designer Susan Gehringer. There were several serious mistakes in the pattern and yet her top looks great.



Sandy Yayanos designed her own shawl, inspired by a Steven Be photo. Her alpaca/wool yarn was from a 2017 luncheon prize basket.



Stacy Mann knit the Gretel top from Cocoknits. She used Habu Textiles N-25 Viscose Sizing Paper, which is 100% flax.



Toni Wong modeled her Oasis Scarf by Shibui Knits. She said the nupps were a challenge. Her top is called Mirage by Sheilla Anderson, knit in Shibui yarns.



Maria Hoham knit the Gavarnie top by Norah Gaughan in Berroco Weekend yarn. She used seed stitch instead of ribbing at the hem.

Want to try your hand at mosaic knitting without a big commitment? Try the Home State cardigan from Pam Sluter in Knitty.com' Deep Fall 2018 issue. It's knit from the top down with raglan sleeves. Mosaic colorwork is used at the bottom edges and the pockets are optional.

Knitty.com's First Fall 2018 issue brings us Millville, by Amy Christoffers. The silhouette and yarn choice are perfect for our climate!

Night Butterfly Shawl from DROPS Design is a good pattern for a knitalong. Get together with your sock yarn leftovers, select your palettes, swap, and share your progress as you go along.

Knit several pairs of short socks in DK weight yarn for quick and easy gifts for the men in your life. Thuja is a masculine pattern that you can spice up with yarn of his choice. Be sure to post pics of your finished pairs in our Ravelry forum.

Cleome Hat from Ficolana is a worsted weight pattern with lace and ribbing to keep it interesting. The pattern is written for three sizes and is both charted and written out.
