



The beauty of Kerry Nare's Winnowing Shawl is visible here and on her Ravelry page. The pattern is from Bristol Ivy, and it's shaped so it stays on the shoulders. Beautiful twisted rib stitches throughout.

Knitting on the Net



Clockwise from top left: Knitted Gingerbread House from designer Frankie Brown is a holiday masterpiece. The roof is hinged so you can fill it with holiday treats. ★ Nora's Mood Slippers from DROPS Design uses broken seed stitch and garter stitch, and a US#6 needle. Great pattern to help you use up your worsted weight stash. ★ Sunset Mountains blanket consists of 20 domino squares in 7 different color combinations of worsted weight yarn. All squares are knit with 1 strand and change color every 2 rows, carrying the unused color along the edge. The squares are knit separately and sewn together for added stability. ★ Almeria Garter Stitch Shawl from DROPS Design is worked in garter stitch from the top down. Make yours cozy or dramatic, depending on your yarn choice. ★ Tri-Coloured Stole from Estelle Yarns is another lovely stash-busting pattern. ★ (Center) WineCozy from Jennifer Carter is a decorative way to give a gift of wine and keep it at the proper temperature on the table!
